

## Sample 4-year plan for Linguistics major

This plan assumes that students start taking Linguistics courses in their first year. This is just one possible example! Many other permutations are possible for students who get started early. See the Linguistics advisor to map out your personal plan.

**Note:** This plan includes only requirements for the Linguistics major itself. Keep in mind that additional courses are needed as well to satisfy breadth, depth, and other specific requirements for your overall degree.

## Sample 4-year plan for Linguistics major with sophomore start

This plan assumes that students take gen ed and other requirements in their first year, and get started on their Linguistics major courses in year 2. This is just one possible example! There are multiple ways that the Linguistics major requirements can be completed in a three-year timeframe. See the Linguistics advisor to map out your personal plan.

**Note:** This plan includes only requirements for the Linguistics major itself. Keep in mind that additional courses are needed as well to satisfy breadth, depth, and other specific requirements for your overall degree.

## Sample 4-year plan for Linguistics major with junior start

Completing a Linguistics major in 4 years with a junior start is challenging and not ideal, due to prerequisites and timing of course offerings. It MAY be possible if students have most other requirements, including four levels of foreign language, completed before their junior year and plan carefully. Course selection will certainly be more limited, and there is little wiggle room to accommodate scheduling conflicts. Consult with the Linguistics advisor as soon as possible if you are considering a late switch to a Linguistics major.
